Argentina arrive at this **Argentina vs Egypt World Cup 2026** showdown in commanding form. Four matches into the tournament, Lionel Messi has been named Player of the Match three times – a statistic that underlines just how far the 38-year-old continues to defy the march of time. His partnership with Lautaro Martínez up front and the engine work of Rodrigo De Paul in midfield have given Lionel Scaloni’s side a devastating blend of craft and industry that few sides in this tournament can match.

Scaloni spoke with quiet confidence in his pre-match press conference ahead of Tuesday's clash. "We are prepared for whatever comes," the Argentina coach said, a simple statement that carried the weight of a team that knows itself inside out. Argentina qualified for the 2026 World Cup unbeaten through South American qualifying, and they have carried that composure into this North American tournament with authority. Their Round of 32 victory included a memorable clash in Miami [a match where Messi's brilliance once again lit up the World Cup stage](#) and the hunger for another deep run is evident in every training session.

The appointment of French referee François Letexier to officiate Tuesday's match underlines its status as one of the tournament's most anticipated Round of 16 ties.

For Egypt, simply being here feels like a historic achievement. The Pharaohs qualified for the 2026 World Cup unbeaten — eight wins from ten qualifying matches — and they seized their group stage berth with both hands. Their reward came in a dramatic penalty shootout victory over Australia in the Round of 32 that will live long in Egyptian football memory.

In that pulsating last-32 tie, Emam Ashour gave Egypt the lead with a thumping header after just 13 minutes. Australia equalised through an unfortunate Mohamed Hany own goal, and after 120 gruelling minutes of drama – including extra time that stretched both squads physically and mentally – Egypt held their nerve from the spot to win 4-2 on penalties, reaching the World Cup Round of 16 for the first time in their history. The celebrations across Cairo and Egypt’s football-mad communities around the world were extraordinary.

The central figure, of course, is Mohamed Salah. The 33-year-old winger entered the Australia match carrying a hamstring concern, at times appearing reluctant to sprint at full speed during the gruelling 120-minute contest. A fully fit Salah against Argentina could create genuine moments of danger, and Egypt’s coaching staff will have done everything possible to ensure he is ready for the biggest match of his international career. Alongside him, Manchester City’s Omar Marmoush offers directness and creativity that will test Argentina’s defensive organisation.

The tournament has already shown that no team is safe in these knockout rounds. [Norway’s stunning 2-1 victory over five-time champions Brazil](#) proved that form and expectation mean little once the knockout stage begins. Could Egypt produce their own seismic upset?

Tactical Outlook: How the Match Could Unfold

Argentina will set up in their familiar 4-3-3 shape, with Messi drifting from the right to find pockets between the lines and link play through De Paul and the midfield. Scaloni’s side press high, transition quickly, and are adept at controlling possession when needed – qualities that will test an Egyptian back line that has been resolute throughout but has not yet faced quality of this calibre.

The key battle could centre on Egypt’s ability to stay compact and use Marmoush’s movement to exploit transitions. If the Pharaohs can keep the score level in the opening exchanges and force Argentina into frustration, the tension inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium could become extraordinary. But Argentina’s quality in set-piece situations and Messi’s uncanny ability to find solutions in tight moments make them overwhelming favourites.

Look for Argentina to prevail in a match that will be closer than the odds suggest – a 2-1 win, with Messi inevitably leaving his mark on another World Cup occasion. Whatever happens inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium, this is a story worth watching. Whether Messi adds another chapter to his remarkable legacy or Salah writes the most stunning upset in Egyptian football history, the Argentina vs Egypt World Cup 2026 Round of 16 is unmissable.
