



Argentina World Cup 2026 Squad: Messi Leads Defending Champions to North America

Description

The **Argentina World Cup 2026 squad** is confirmed, and Lionel Messi leads the defending champions for a record sixth World Cup. Head coach Lionel Scaloni named his 26-man list on Thursday, 28 May 2026, squashing fears over Messi's hamstring scare to hand the 38-year-old captain his place on football's biggest stage once more. The anxiety was palpable. When Messi limped off during an MLS match for Inter Miami in the lead-up to the squad announcement, Argentine supporters braced themselves for the unthinkable. Scaloni moved swiftly to calm the storm, insisting the injury was "not that bad" and that his talisman would recover in time for the tournament, even if he might not be fully fit for the opening fixtures.

That assurance proved enough. Messi, eight-time Ballon d'Or winner, World Cup champion, Copa Am rica champion twice over, has been named in the squad, and he will captain Argentina into their first defence of a World Cup title since Brazil in 1970. At 38, it will almost certainly be his final tournament at this level. The anticipation is extraordinary.

Scaloni's logic is sound: even a Messi operating at 80 per cent is still a generational talent capable of winning any game on his own. The greater risk would have been leaving him at home.

Scaloni has kept the architecture of the side that won the World Cup in Qatar 2022, retaining 17 players from that squad. The core of Emiliano MartÃnez in goal, Lisandro MartÃnez and Cristian Romero in

defence, Rodrigo De Paul and Enzo Fernandez in midfield, and Julin lvarez and Lautaro Martnez up front remains gloriously intact. The new faces bring energy and unpredictability.

Argentina's Route Through the World Cup 2026

The tournament kicks off on 11 June 2026, hosted across the United States, Canada, and Mexico — three nations collectively offering a scale and atmosphere unlike anything the World Cup has seen. For Scaloni's side, every match comes with the weight of defending champions. There is nowhere to hide, and no underestimating anyone.

Argentina's rivals are acutely aware of what they face. [England](#), [Brazil](#), [France](#), and [Portugal](#) have all assembled strong squads - all desperate to end what could be the final chapter of the Messi era. The group stage will demand Argentina hit their stride quickly, particularly if Messi's fitness requires careful management in the opening rounds.

Can Argentina Retain the World Cup?

There is every reason to believe they can. Scaloni has built something rare: a team with genuine tactical flexibility, unshakeable team spirit, and the best player in history leading the line. The midfield engine of Enzo Fernandez, Alexis Mac Allister, and Rodrigo De Paul is one of the most balanced in world football. Julin lvarez - who lit up Qatar 2022 with four goals - will be at the peak of his powers, and Lautaro Martnez is one of the most lethal strikers on the planet.

The defence is experienced and battle-hardened. Emi Martnez, one of the best goalkeepers in the world, is a match-winner in his own right as France discovered in 2022. The togetherness Scaloni has fostered over 94 matches in charge is not something that can be replicated overnight by rival coaches.

The World Cup 2026 will be full of brilliant sides, but Argentina arrive as the team to beat. With Messi making his final bow on the sport's grandest stage, the whole world will be watching - and the Albiceleste are determined to make it one last golden chapter.
