Description

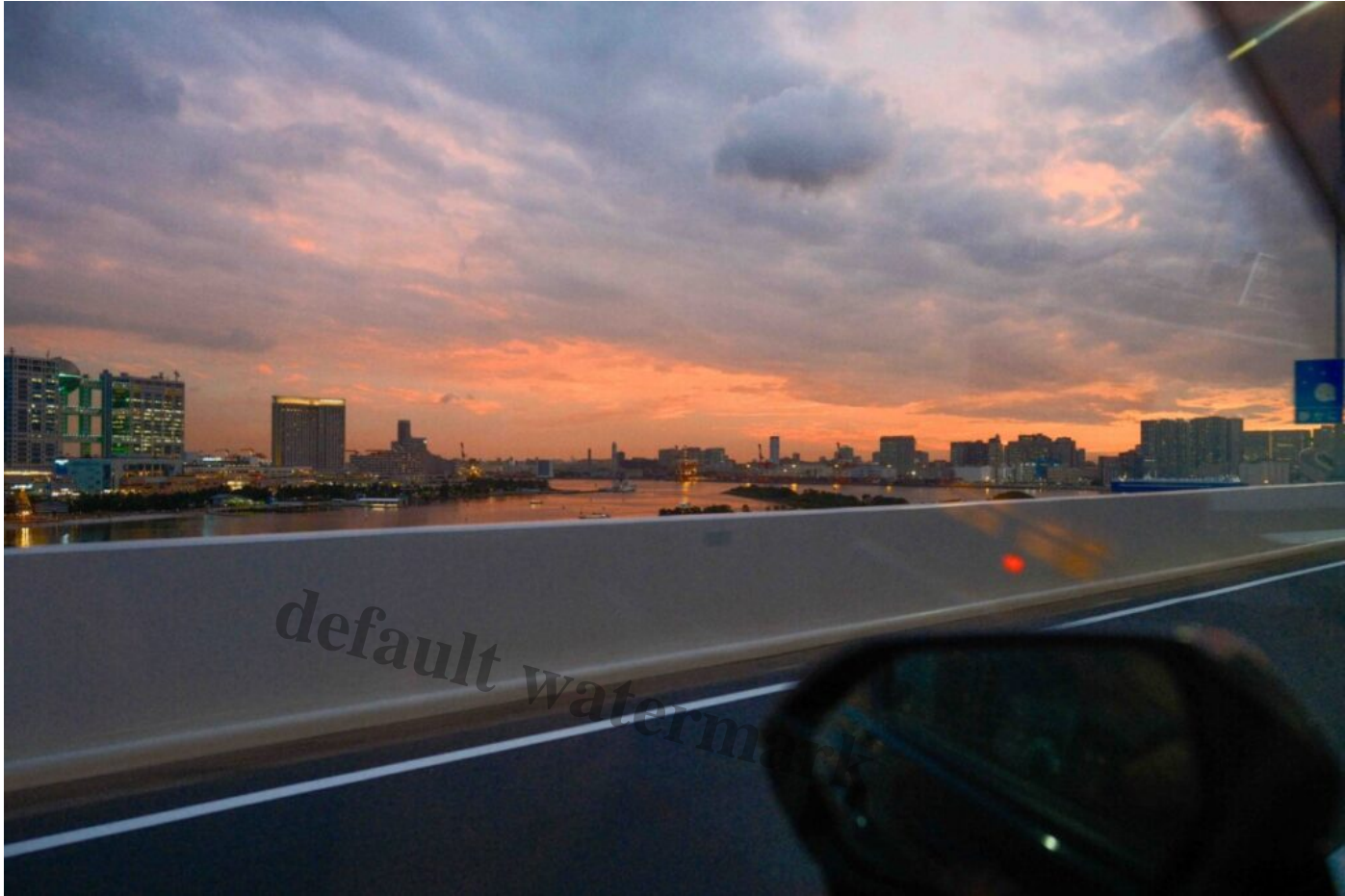

Richmond Hotel Morioka. This is our hotel for the night. It was spacious and clean.





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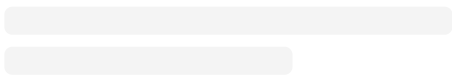
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And thereâ??s a connected mini mart from the hotel lobby. Plus the fact itâ??s next to the train station, I think itâ??s very good value for money.
