



Best Flight Deals From Singapore Right Now – April & May 2026 Round-Up

If you've been holding off on booking that holiday, now is the time to act. Several airlines and travel platforms are running compelling promotions right now, with fares from Singapore starting as low as **\$198 for regional getaways** and attractive discounts on longer-haul routes to Europe, Japan, Australia and beyond.

Here's your updated round-up of the best flight deals departing Singapore in April and May 2026 so you can book smart and travel more.

1. Singapore Airlines – From \$198 to Southeast Asia

Singapore Airlines has been running a series of promotional fares throughout March and April 2026, and several deals are still bookable for upcoming travel dates.

Key highlights include:

- **Student Fares – Extra 10% Off:** Full-time students enjoy an additional 10% discount on student fares, plus benefits like extra baggage allowance and a one-time booking fee waiver.

Applies to travel between March 2026 and January 2027.

2. KrisFlyer Spontaneous Escapes – 30% Off Award Redemptions

If you've been accumulating KrisFlyer miles, here's an excellent opportunity to put them to use. Singapore Airlines' **Spontaneous Escapes** promotion is currently offering **30% off Saver award redemptions** on selected routes.

This essentially means you need fewer miles to redeem a flight – great news for loyal KrisFlyer members who want to stretch their points further. Check the KrisFlyer portal or the Singapore Airlines app for the latest available routes and seat availability.

3. Trip.com – \$50 Off Singapore Airlines Flights

Online travel platform **Trip.com** is offering an exclusive **\$50 off** your flight booking on Singapore Airlines when you book through their platform. The promotion is valid through to the end of 2026 on a first-come, first-served basis, so don't wait too long.

Trip.com also regularly features flash sales and promo codes for hotels and activity packages – making it a one-stop shop if you're planning a full holiday bundle. Check sg.trip.com for the latest codes.

4. Scoot – Budget Deals Across Asia

For budget-conscious travellers, **Scoot** remains one of the best options for affordable travel across Asia. The low-cost carrier regularly runs flash sales and promotional fares, particularly for popular routes such as:

- Singapore to Tokyo (Narita) and Osaka
- Singapore to Bangkok (Don Mueang)
- Singapore to Athens (via connecting hubs)
- Singapore to Perth, Gold Coast, and Sydney

Scoot's promotional fares can be significantly cheaper than full-service airlines, especially if you travel light. Keep an eye on their website at flyscoot.com and subscribe to their newsletter for the earliest access to deals.

5. Top Destinations Worth Booking Right Now

With promotions available across the board, these are the destinations our team thinks are worth prioritising for your next trip from Singapore:

Tokyo & Osaka, Japan

Japan continues to be one of the most popular destinations for Singaporeans in 2026, and for good reason. Cherry blossom season may have passed, but late April and May are actually an ideal time to visit – the weather is pleasant, the crowds have thinned slightly, and hotel prices are more reasonable. Book early for the summer months if you’re eyeing July or August.

Bali, Indonesia

Always a favourite, Bali offers unbeatable value for money – especially with regional fares starting from \$198. May is one of the best months to visit, as the island sits on the cusp between wet and dry seasons, with warm sunny days and lush green landscapes. The cultural calendar is also rich, with traditional Balinese ceremonies taking place throughout the month.

Bangkok, Thailand

Bangkok remains one of Southeast Asia’s most dynamic cities for food, nightlife, shopping, and culture. With direct flights from as little as \$198 and frequent promotional fares from both Singapore Airlines and Scoot, there’s never been a better time to plan a long weekend. Don’t miss the street food scene along Yaowarat (Chinatown) and the new wave of rooftop bars in the Silom and Sukhumvit districts.

Melbourne & Sydney, Australia

Australia’s two biggest cities are well worth the longer flight time. May marks the beginning of autumn Down Under – perfect weather for exploring outdoor markets, wine country, and world-class restaurants. Look out for Singapore Airlines’ promotional business class fares to Australia, which regularly appear on MileLion and Seedly travel deal alerts.

London & Paris, Europe

May is arguably the best month to visit Europe – warm and sunny without the peak summer crowds. Singapore Airlines flies direct to London Heathrow, while connecting services are available to virtually every major European city. If you’ve been saving miles, this is a great time to redeem for a Business Class reward seat to Europe.

Tips for Finding the Best Deals

- **Be flexible with dates:** Flying on a Tuesday or Wednesday is typically cheaper than weekends. Adjust your departure date by a day or two and the savings can be significant.
- **Set fare alerts:** Use Google Flights or Skyscanner to set fare alerts for your target destination. You’ll get notified when prices drop.
- **Book early:** For popular destinations like Japan during peak seasons, booking 3–6 months in advance is advisable. For last-minute regional trips, Scoot and Jetstar often drop prices close to departure.

- **Stack your credit card rewards:** Use a miles credit card when booking flights to earn additional air miles on top of any promotional fares. Cards like the DBS Altitude, UOB PRVI Miles, or Citi PremierMiles are popular choices for Singapore frequent flyers.
- **Check The MileLion:** Singapore's most comprehensive travel hacking resource at milelion.com regularly publishes deal alerts, mistake fares, and redemption sweet spots. It's required reading for any Singaporean travel enthusiast.

Don't Wait Too Long

Promotional fares have limited seat availability, and the best deals disappear fast — especially on popular routes to Japan and Australia. If any of the offers above appeal to you, our advice is simple: check the fare, confirm it works for your travel dates, and book it.
