


Catching Sakura: My 12 Days Self-Drive Itinerary through Sendai, Fukushima, Nikko, and Tokyo in Spring – Day 3

Looks nice but this is only about 50% to 60% bloom. Peak will probably come in another 1 to 2 weeks' time.


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This is one of the best photo spots in the park. The tram passing through the rows of Sakura trees.

You can take this tram instead of walking up the slope to the hill top.






Besides the tram, the other iconic photo spot is when you climb all the way to the hill top. There, you see this giant statue of Guan Yin.

This was not planned. Sometime life's best moments come from impromptu discovery. I personally love travelling this way.


I do not think as a tourist, you will ever have any business being in this part of the town. There's literally nothing nearby.

It was on the way to our next destination and doing some research, this shop popped up on my radar.






It was run by an elderly couple. The sashimi / sushi was very fresh and I remember we only paid SGD10 per pax for this wonderful meal.



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Zao Ropeway Zao Sanroku Station



It was not cold at all, I was just wearing a jacket up the ropeway.




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Yes and this is why we went up the ropeway. It was super cool so trudge through the snow and also see **Zao Jizoson** partially covered in snow.
