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Seems like a magazine front cover, right? In fact, at the event, I got myself dressed in traditional Chinese Hanfu, fully embracing the cultural experience.

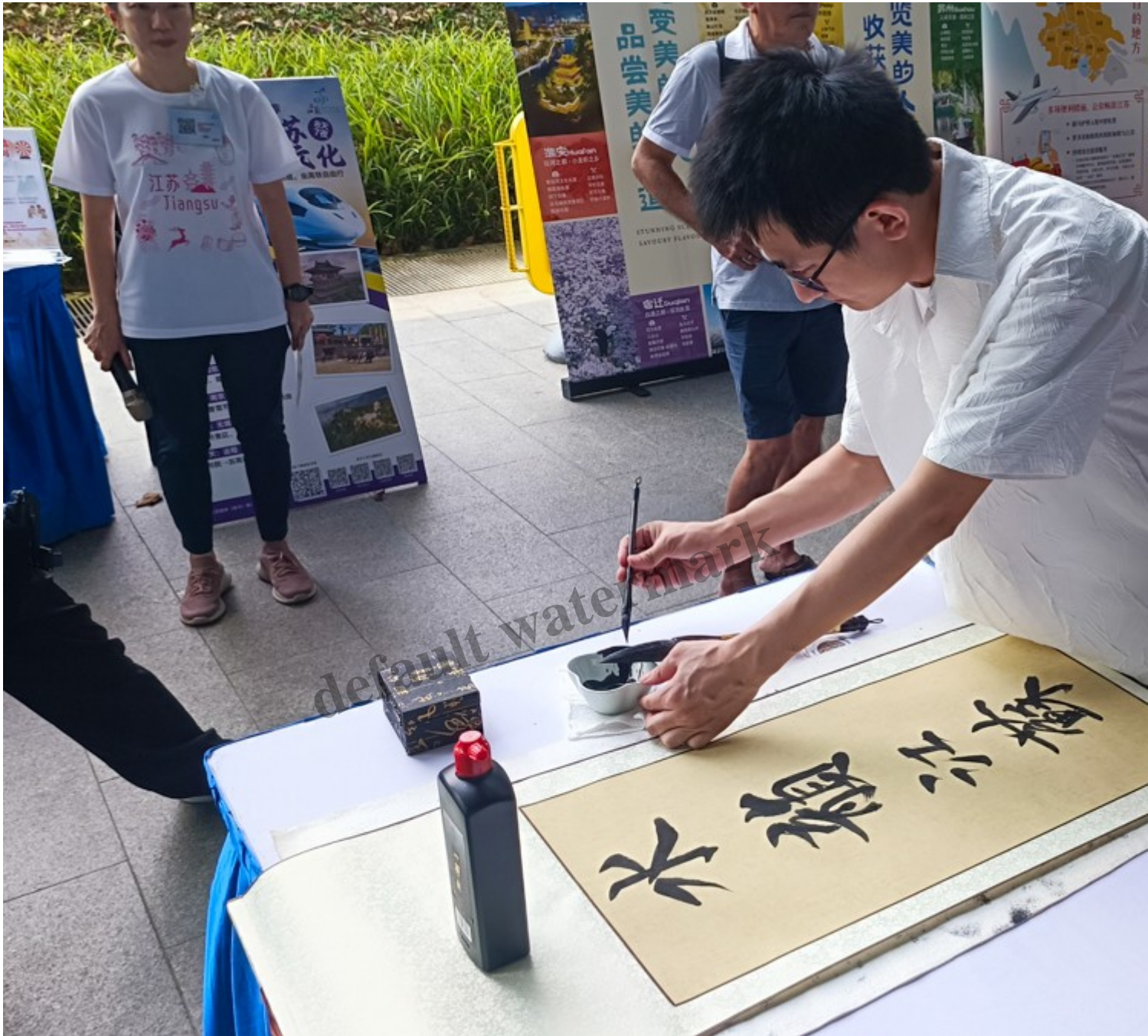
