



## Contours Of Being At ArtScience Cinema: Weekend Film Screenings From 16 May

### Description

Contours Of Being starts at ArtScience Cinema on 16 May 2026, and it is a quieter but more thoughtful counterpoint to the louder entertainment calendar around Marina Bay. The ticketed programme runs on weekends until 28 June, with films selected around bodies, memory, care and the way everyday gestures carry age and experience.



Contours Of Being runs at ArtScience Cinema from 16 May to 28 June 2026.

ArtScience Cinema frames the programme as three pairings that listen to bodies in time. The named filmmakers include Naomi Kawase, Margaret Tait, Kimi Takesue, Gladys Ng and Agn s Varda, with the programme placed in conversation with the museum's *Flesh and Bones: The Art of Anatomy* exhibition.

## Who This Is For

This is not a casual blockbuster slot. It is better suited to filmgoers who enjoy slower cinema, documentary texture, essay-film language and works that ask viewers to pay attention to small movements rather than plot twists. If you like programmes that sit between art, ageing, family memory and physical presence, it is worth a look.

The Singapore angle is also practical. ArtScience Cinema notes that nearly one in four Singapore citizens is projected to be 65 and above by 2030, making questions of care, ageing and changing bodies more urgent. That does not turn the films into policy lectures. It gives the programme a local reason to land.

## Ticketing And Timing

The screenings are ticketed and held at ArtScience Cinema, Level 4. Because this is a curated programme rather than a daily free screening series, choose the exact date and pairing before going. Film pairings can have different emotional weight, pacing and accessibility for different viewers.

If you are already planning a museum visit, this can pair naturally with *Flesh and Bones*, but do not overload the day. A body-focused exhibition followed by a reflective film programme may be rewarding, but it can also be a lot to take in if you are rushing between meals and errands.
