

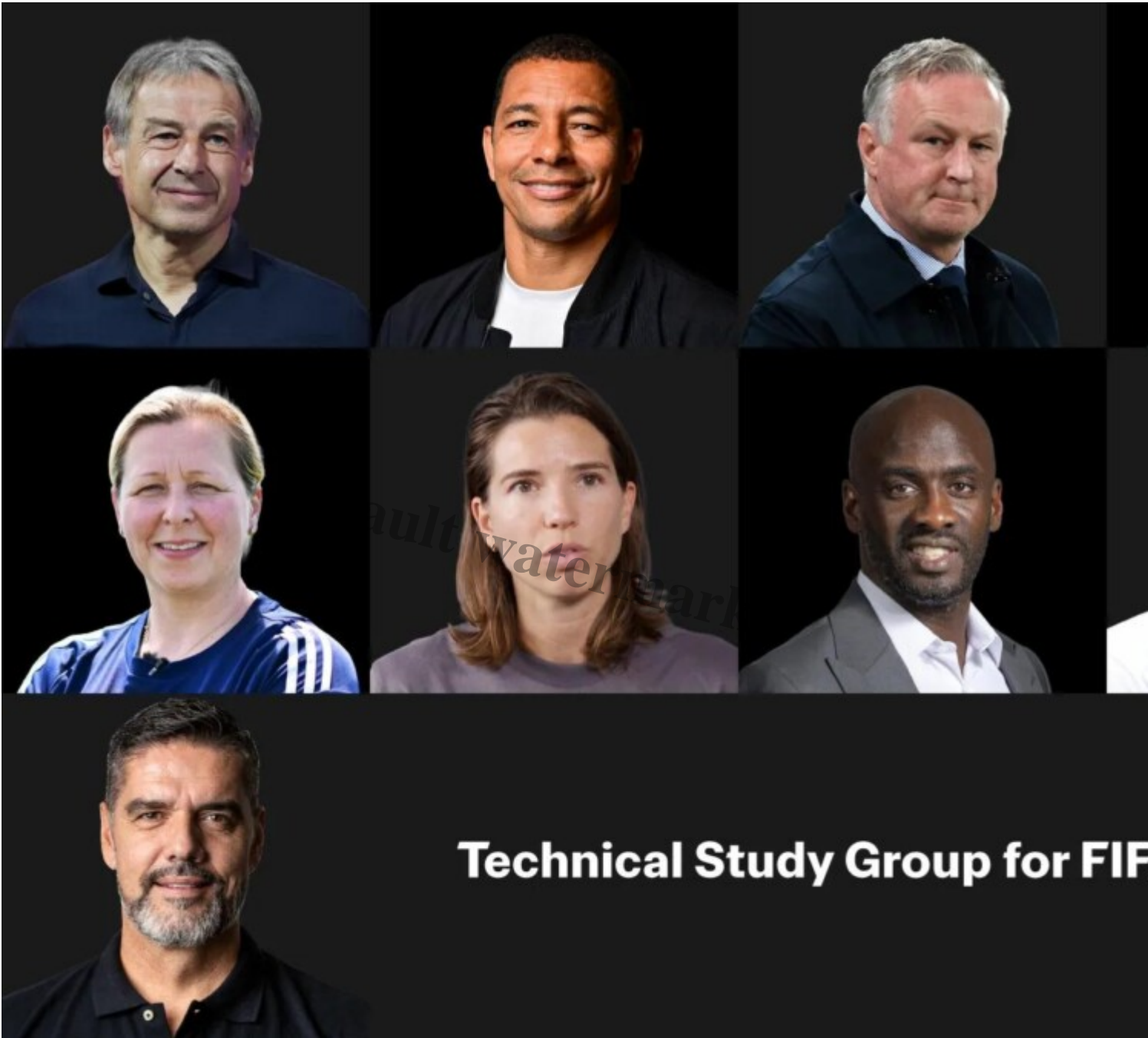


FIFA World Cup 2026 Opening Match Guide: Five Days To The Kickoff

Description

The **FIFA World Cup 2026 opening match** is just five days away, and the greatest show on earth is preparing to kick off in spectacular fashion. On Thursday, 11 June, Mexico City's historic Estadio Azteca will host the curtain-raiser as the host nation face South Africa – the first time this legendary stadium has staged a World Cup opener for a remarkable third time, having previously done so in 1970 and 1986.

With 48 nations, 104 matches across 16 host cities, and three co-host countries (Canada, Mexico and the United States), the 2026 edition is the largest and most ambitious World Cup in history. Singapore fans can catch every match on [Mediacorp's mewatch and Channel 5](#).

The Opening Match: Mexico vs South Africa

There is no bigger occasion in football than a World Cup opener, and El Tri are relishing the chance to welcome the world to their doorstep. Mexico face a South Africa side making their first World Cup appearance since 2010, and one that has shown considerable resilience under Hugo Broos. The match kicks off at 3pm ET on 11 June (3am Singapore time on 12 June).

Mexico will also face South Korea and Czechia in Group A. The Azteca will be rocking â?? the atmosphere at the iconic venue is expected to be unlike anything seen in recent World Cups. South

Africa's Bafana Bafana will be desperate to spring a surprise and announce themselves on the world stage once more.

Groups To Watch: The Key Storylines

The 48-team format features 12 groups of four teams, with the top two from each group advancing to the round of 32. Here are the groups Singaporean fans will be watching most closely:

Group C: Brazil vs Morocco Carlo Ancelotti's [Brazil](#), boosted by Neymar's high-profile return, face Morocco the side that stunned the world at Qatar 2022 in one of the opening weekend's most mouth-watering clashes on 13 June in New Jersey. A Neymar versus Achraf Hakimi showdown on the biggest stage? Sign us up.

Group D: USA vs Paraguay The co-hosts kick off their campaign on 12 June at SoFi Stadium in Los Angeles, with the eyes of North America fixed on a team hungry to make history on home soil.

Group B: Canada vs Bosnia-Herzegovina Canada makes their first World Cup appearance since 1986, hosting their opener in Toronto on 12 June in front of what promises to be a deafening home crowd.

France, [Japan](#), England, Germany, and Spain all arrive with genuine ambitions, while the expanded format means more nations than ever have a realistic path to the knockout stages. The 104-match schedule runs from 11 June to 19 July, with the final at New York New Jersey Stadium.
