This is the big monthly meet-up for the Singapore gardening community. The June edition lands smack in the school holidays, which makes it an easy family outing.

Gardenersâ?? Day Out 13-14 June 2026 at a glance

- **Dates:** Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 June 2026.

- **Venue:** Jurong Lake Gardens.
- **Organiser:** National Parks Board (NParks).
- **Cost:** Free entry; some workshops and tours may need pre-registration.
- **Family-friendly:** Yes – suitable for kids and grandparents alike.

What's on the programme

The Gardeners' Day Out runs as a one-stop gardening lifestyle event. Expect:

- **Plant bazaars** – community plant exchanges and home-grower stalls.
- **Talks** – usually a mix of edible gardening, urban-balcony tips and tropical orchid care.
- **Workshops** – hands-on sessions covering propagation, repotting, terrariums.
- **Guided garden tours** – wander through Jurong Lake Gardens with NParks guides.
- **Children's activities** – nature crafts and seed-planting stations for the kids.

Why Jurong Lake Gardens is the right venue

Jurong Lake Gardens replaced the old Chinese and Japanese Gardens and is now one of Singapore's most family-friendly green spaces. The grasslands, water features and the Forest Ramble play area make it a natural fit for a weekend programme that mixes serious gardening with kids' nature play.

How to get there

- **MRT:** Lakeside (EW26) – about a 5-minute walk to the gardens.
- **Car park:** Multiple lots; arrive early on Saturday morning for the best spots.
- **What to bring:** Reusable water bottle, sun hat, light insect repellent, eco-friendly bag for any plant purchases.
- **Best time:** Morning sessions are cooler; afternoon is quieter if you want a relaxed wander.

If you have been meaning to start a balcony edible garden but kept procrastinating, the 13-14 June Gardeners' Day Out is a low-friction reason to finally show up, grab the seeds, and start.
