



Genting Dream Cruise From Singapore 2026: Prices and Deals

Description

If a weekend at sea sounds better than another queue at the Causeway, 2026 is a good year to sail. The **Genting Dream cruise from Singapore** is running year-round out of the Marina Bay Cruise Centre, and Resorts World Cruises has wrapped the whole year in a *Decade of Dreams* celebration to mark the ship's 10th anniversary. The headline draw for wallets: a limited-time buy-one-get-one-free deal across all Genting Dream sailings. Here is what Singapore-based travellers need to know before booking.

Why the Genting Dream cruise from Singapore is worth a look in 2026

The Genting Dream is a 3,352-guest ship that sails round trips from the Marina Bay Cruise Centre Singapore (MBCCS) at 61 Marina Coastal Drive, a short taxi or MRT-and-shuttle hop from town. For 2026 the line is marking a decade at sea with a year-long programme of celebrity chef dinners, wellness sessions and live entertainment, alongside the usual water slides, casino, spa and multiple dining venues. From 20 April 2026, the same ship also began sailing from Kuala Lumpur via Port Klang, so there is more choice of embarkation if you fancy pairing the cruise with a road trip up north.

Itineraries: from a quick 2-night reset to a 5-night island run

The beauty of cruising ex-Singapore is that you choose how much time you have. Sailings run from 2 to 5 nights, so you can slot one into a long weekend or stretch it into a proper holiday.

Short getaways (2-3 nights)

Two-night weekend sailings typically depart on Fridays as a "high seas" cruise to nowhere, which is ideal if you just want to switch off. Two-night Sunday departures head to Kuala Lumpur via Melaka or Port Klang, while three-night Tuesday departures reach Penang, Kuala Lumpur, Phuket or Pulau Redang. If you enjoyed our [Melaka weekend getaway guide](#), seeing the same coastline from the deck is a relaxed alternative.

Longer sailings (4-5 nights)

Special four- and five-night itineraries include the Island Paradise Cruise to Koh Samui and Pulau Redang, the Amazing Thailand Cruise to Bangkok (via Laem Chabang) and Koh Samui, and the Mystical Bali Cruise to South and North Bali. These sell out faster during the June and year-end school holidays, so book early if your dates are fixed.

How much does it cost in SGD?

Fares move with the season and cabin type, but as a guide, a 2-night sailing starts from around **SGD 299 per person** (twin-share) for an interior cabin, with balcony staterooms from roughly **SGD 478 per person** for the same two nights. The *Decade of Dreams* buy-one-get-one-free promotion, when applied, effectively halves the lead-in fare for two guests sharing, with special rates layered on for third and fourth guests in the same cabin, handy for families.

Budget for the extras that are not in the headline fare: mandatory gratuities of about SGD 27 to 40 per person per night, port charges of roughly SGD 50 to 90, and a fuel surcharge of about SGD 15 per night introduced from March 2026. Drinks packages, specialty dining and shore excursions are additional. Always read the final breakdown at checkout so the "from" price does not surprise you.

Booking tips for Singapore travellers

Compare the same sailing across the Resorts World Cruises site, Klook and Trip.com, as each runs its own cabin allocations and add-on bundles. The buy-one-get-one-free deal is time-limited, so check that your chosen date still qualifies before you commit. Weekend and holiday departures carry a premium; a midweek Tuesday sailing is usually the better value if your calendar is flexible.

A few practical notes. Singapore citizens and residents still need a valid passport with at least six monthsâ?? validity for the foreign port calls, and check visa rules for any Thailand or Indonesia stops. Get to MBCCS at least two to three hours before departure for check-in and security. If you would rather stay closer to home, our guides to a [Bintan weekend getaway](#) and a [Batam weekend getaway](#) cover ferry-based alternatives that are lighter on the wallet.

The verdict

For a fuss-free escape with no airport queues, the Genting Dream cruise from Singapore is one of the easiest holidays to organise in 2026, and the anniversary buy-one-get-one-free deal makes the short sailings genuinely competitive with a mainland hotel stay. Lock in a midweek departure, budget honestly for the port charges and gratuities, and you have a weekend at sea sorted. If a cruise is not your thing this round, a cheap flight might be, so it is worth scanning current [Scoot flight deals from Singapore](#) before you decide.
