



Go Green SG 2026 Guide: Climate Adaptation Events To Bookmark

Description

Go Green SG 2026 is the practical sustainability calendar to watch through June. The Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment says the fourth edition runs from 11 May to 28 June 2026 and supports Singapore's Year of Climate Adaptation.

The scale is broad: around 500 partners and more than 1,000 initiatives across community, schools, nature, business and lifestyle touchpoints. That makes the site useful not just for environmental enthusiasts, but for families looking for a weekend activity with a clearer purpose.

Events Worth Shortlisting

The official Go Green SG activity list includes Festival of Biodiversity at the National Library Building on 6 and 7 June, COOL Geylang workshops on climate adaptation, Pasir Ris Park mangrove walks across several June dates, and a behind-the-scenes look at Singapore's mosquito factory on 27 June.

The thread linking these activities is adaptation. Instead of asking residents only to recycle or reduce waste, this year's programme makes heat, biodiversity, mosquito management, parks and coastal ecosystems more visible as daily-life topics.

- Festival of Biodiversity: 6 and 7 June at National Library Building.
- Pasir Ris Park mangrove walks: multiple June dates listed by Go Green SG.
- Mosquito factory behind-the-scenes: 27 June.

How To Pick A Session

Families with younger children should start with indoor or structured events, while older children can handle park walks if the timing avoids the hottest part of the day. If you are going outdoors, bring water, hats and insect repellent, and treat the activity as a learning walk rather than a race.
