



In Green – Asuka Hishiki At Singapore Botanic Gardens: Free Botanical Art Exhibition Guide

Description

In Green – Asuka Hishiki at the Singapore Botanic Gardens' Botanical Art Gallery is one of the quieter June 2026 picks for art and nature lovers. Asuka Hishiki is a Japanese botanical artist whose hyper-detailed watercolour studies of plants are the kind of work that pulls you right up to the glass.

The Botanical Art Gallery sits inside SBG's heritage precinct – free to enter, air-conditioned, and a tidy stop between a wander through the Orchid Garden and a coffee at Park Side.

In Green ?? Asuka Hishiki at a glance

- **Venue:** Botanical Art Gallery, Singapore Botanic Gardens.

- **Artist:** Asuka Hishiki     Japanese botanical artist.
- **Format:** Watercolour botanical art exhibition.
- **Cost:** Free entry to the gallery.
- **Best for:** Art lovers, illustrators, families with older kids, photographers chasing quiet visuals.

Why Asuka Hishiki is worth knowing

Botanical art sits between scientific illustration and fine art. Asuka Hishiki   s pieces lean into texture, leaf veins and the subtle gradations of pigment that you only catch when you stand close. The level of detail rewards a slow second pass through the gallery.

Bring a sketchbook     the gallery is one of the few in Singapore where casual sketching is welcomed.

What to pair with the exhibition

- **National Orchid Garden**     a 15-minute walk away, S\$15 for adults; the orchids in bloom pair well with the watercolour studies.
- **Park Side by PS.Cafe**     the SBG cafe for a relaxed brunch or tea between visits.
- **Healing Garden**     a free corner of SBG focused on medicinal plants, a calm follow-up to the gallery.
- **Foliage Garden**     recently refreshed; the texture-rich plants there echo Hishiki   s subject matter.

How to get there

- **MRT:** Botanic Gardens (CC19/DT9)     Tanglin Gate entrance is the easiest for the Botanical Art Gallery.
- **Opening hours:** Gallery typically opens 9am to 6pm, daily. Confirm via the SBG calendar before heading down.
- **Photography:** Allowed for personal use; no flash near the watercolours.
- **Family tip:** Pair with the Jacob Ballas Children   s Garden on the Bukit Timah side for a full half-day.

If you have been searching for a quieter June holiday outing that does not involve queueing at the next K-pop pop-up, this is it.
