



Real Madrid 2026/27: Mourinho Is Back and He Means Business

A Season to Forget, a Hire to Remember

Real Madridâ??s 2025/26 campaign was one Florentino PÃ©rez will want expunged from the record books. The decision to appoint Xabi Alonso â?? fresh from his Bayer Leverkusen revolution â?? never translated into the fluent football Madrid demanded. With the team trophyless and stuttering, Alonso was relieved of his duties mid-season, and club legend Ãlvoro Arbeloa stepped in to steady the ship on an interim basis. Madrid finished without silverware for the first time in recent memory: no Liga, no Copa, no Champions League.

Florentinoâ??s response was equal parts nostalgic and decisive. He turned to Mourinho â?? the 63-year-old Portuguese tactician who delivered two La Liga titles, a Copa del Rey and a run to the Champions League final during his first spell between 2010 and 2013. The Special One, after stints at Chelsea, Tottenham, Roma and Bayern, has never stopped chasing legacy. At the BernabÃ©u, he gets his grandest stage once more.

Four Signings That Signal the New Direction

Mourinho has moved swiftly in the market, with four arrivals shaping the contours of the 2026/27 squad. The marquee name is **Bernardo Silva**, the Portuguese playmaker who joined as a free agent after his Manchester City contract expired. A personal request from Mourinho â?? who knows his compatriot's quality from years of cross-league observation â?? Bernardo arrives with Champions League gold in his locker and a footballing intelligence that is perfectly suited to the orchestrating midfield role Los Blancos so desperately need.

At the back, **Ibrahima KonatÃ©** arrives from Liverpool on a free transfer to provide towering authority at centre-back. The Frenchman was one of the outstanding defenders at the 2026 World Cup, and his combination of aerial dominance and composure in possession gives Mourinho a genuine defensive cornerstone. Flanking him, **Marc Cucurella** (left-back) and **Denzel Dumfries** (right-back) complete an overhaul of a back line that haemorrhaged goals last term.

The logic of the four signings is distinctly Mourinho: defensive solidity through experienced, proven operators at the back; attacking craft through a world-class orchestrator in midfield. It is a blueprint he has deployed at every club he has managed, and at Madrid, with Vinicius Jr still leading the line after [speculation about his future earlier this summer](#), the raw material is formidable.

Pre-Season: Early Glimmers in Austria

The on-field reunion began at the Wörthersee Stadion in Klagenfurt, Austria, on 1 August, when Madrid faced Serie A side Fiorentina in their first pre-season friendly. The result was a 2-2 draw — unremarkable in itself, but notable for what it revealed about the new era's mood. With Bernardo Silva, Koke and Cucurella still on post-World Cup holidays, Mourinho's squad was understandably under-strength. His quip after the game — that — the good ones — had yet to arrive — was vintage Mourinho: cutting, self-aware and utterly magnetic.

There is nothing accidental about that kind of statement. Mourinho knows the value of anticipation, of creating a narrative before a ball is kicked in earnest. When his full complement assembles, the squad's potential will snap into much clearer focus.

The pre-season schedule continues with Ferencváros in Budapest (8 August), the traditional Teresa Herrera Trophy (12 August) and a match against Schalke 04 in Gelsenkirchen (16 August). La Liga begins in earnest on 22 August with a trip to Espanyol — after which the mask fully comes off.

Real Madrid and La Liga: The Only Goal That Matters

While [Arsenal refine their title-winning squad in England](#) and [PSG reshape for a new European assault](#), the message from Madrid is clear: Los Blancos are done with their off year, and they intend to reclaim what they consider rightfully theirs. Barcelona, Atl tico Madrid and the rest of La Liga  s contenders will need to answer back with actions of their own.

Mourinho, for his part, has never been content with moral victories. He returns to Madrid having lived through the full spectrum of football  s highs and lows, and the hunger in his eyes suggests he has arrived not for a twilight curtain call, but for a genuine final chapter of conquest. The Bernab   faithful will be hoping he is right.

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
