Childhood Vaccinations: Build a Catch-Up Checklist

Description

Parents can view a child's immunisation record in HealthHub with Singpass and compare it with the current National Childhood Immunisation Schedule. A missing or late entry is a reason to check with the clinic—not to restart a vaccine series or design a catch-up schedule without medical advice.

Singapore childhood vaccination schedule: the decision table

Situation	What to do
Record matches schedule	Keep the dated record
Dose appears missing	Check clinic records and ask a clinician
Child is unwell on appointment day	Call the provider for advice
Persistent or serious reaction	Seek medical care promptly

Use the 1 April 2026 schedule

The official image is dated. Old screenshots or baby books may not reflect the current recommendation, so record the version used.

Match dose and date, not colour alone

Write vaccine, dose number, date given and provider. Combination vaccines may record several components in one visit.

Distinguish recommendation from individual advice

Medical history, allergies, travel and previous reactions can change timing. A clinician should determine catch-up.

Prepare for normal short-term effects

HealthHub describes pain, redness, mild fever and other common reactions, while advising medical review for persistent or concerning symptoms.

Keep records portable

Download the HealthHub record and retain clinic documents, especially before travel, school changes or moving overseas.

Worked example

A parent sees no obvious second MMR entry in a paper booklet. The checklist first compares HealthHub, clinic receipts and the dated NCIS row. If the records still differ, the parent sends the dates and images to the clinic. The output is a verified gap list, not a home-made vaccination order.

Turn the example into a decision record

The worked example is useful only if its inputs are replaced with the reader's actual dates, amounts, documents or observations. For this task—prepare an accurate record comparison and obtain clinician advice for any gap—keep the decision and its supporting record on the same line. That exposes a missing input before the action becomes difficult to reverse.

Trigger or question	Current action	Evidence to retain
1. Record matches schedule	Keep the dated record	Save the dated input, confirmation or advice that supports this choice.
2. Dose appears missing	Check clinic records and ask a clinician	Save the dated input, confirmation or advice that supports this choice.
3. Child is unwell on appointment day	Call the provider for advice	Save the dated input, confirmation or advice that supports this choice.
4. Persistent or serious reaction	Seek medical care promptly	Save the dated input, confirmation or advice that supports this choice.

Record where each answer came from and when it was checked. If a live service, signed document or professional opinion conflicts with a general webpage, preserve both and resolve the difference with the body responsible for the decision. Do not silently substitute a convenient number or date.

Action checklist

1. Open the child's HealthHub record

2. Download the current NCIS
3. List each vaccine and dose
4. Match dates and provider records
5. Flag discrepancies without guessing
6. Book clinician review
7. Save the updated record

Two practical tools to keep

A dose-by-dose record reconciliation table. Put the controlling dates, amounts or observations in one place and attach the evidence beside each input. This makes the decision reproducible if a family member, colleague or adviser needs to check it later.

A clinician-ready discrepancy pack. Test the ordinary case and the failure case before money, a filing or a booking becomes irreversible. Mark calculations as calculations and leave uncertain fields unresolved until an authority or qualified professional confirms them.

What the primary sources establish

Primary source	Claim used here
HealthHub childhood immunisation guide	Schedule, common reactions, subsidies and record access.
HealthHub student immunisation and screening	School vaccination, safety information and HealthHub records.

The links sit beside the claims they support. Live services, formal notices and individual facts can change the outcome, so re-open the controlling page immediately before acting.

Errors that change the outcome

- Using an old schedule image
- Assuming a blank paper row means no dose
- Restarting a series without advice
- Ignoring combination-vaccine entries
- Delaying care for a serious reaction

Keep dated records, confirmations and advice used for the decision. This article explains public information for a general fact pattern; it does not determine an individual legal, tax, medical, investment, employment or contractual outcome.

A final challenge before acting

The intended reader is a singapore parent checking whether a child's vaccination record is complete. Before closing the task, challenge the file against the common failure points below. A not applicable answer should still have a reason, especially where a deadline, eligibility rule, payment, booking or safety decision is involved.

- **Have you ruled this out?** Using an old schedule image. Write down the fact or document that answers it; an assumption is not a completed check.
- **Have you ruled this out?** Assuming a blank paper row means no dose. Write down the fact or document that answers it; an assumption is not a completed check.
- **Have you ruled this out?** Restarting a series without advice. Write down the fact or document that answers it; an assumption is not a completed check.
- **Have you ruled this out?** Ignoring combination-vaccine entries. Write down the fact or document that answers it; an assumption is not a completed check.
- **Have you ruled this out?** Delaying care for a serious reaction. Write down the fact or document that answers it; an assumption is not a completed check.

Escalate any unresolved consequential point to the named authority or an appropriately qualified professional. The aim is not to collect more material; it is to identify the one missing fact that could change the result.

Questions readers ask

Are NCIS vaccinations subsidised?

HealthHub states full subsidies for Singaporean children at CHAS GP clinics and polyclinics for eligible schedule vaccinations and brands.

Can parents create a catch-up schedule?

A clinician should determine catch-up based on the child's record and health.

Where are records found?

HealthHub provides access with Singpass.
