


Singapore Heritage Festival 2024 – What To Expect

We were given a flavour of what to expect for the festival month. I will briefly blog about my experience attending the media event.




Our first meeting was on the lawn outside the National Museum of Singapore. Here is the art installation titled HOMEGROUND: We Built This City.










I especially love the use of playful, vibrant colours. Makes for excellent photo opportunities.

This previews the Hop-On, Hop-Off (HOHO) Bus Experience.




Participants can explore the built heritage of these precincts – Chinatown, Kampong Glam, Little India, Bras Basah, Bugis and Civic District.


Registration is required, so please check the official website for more information.

Due to limited time (the actual tour will be a full day), we are headed to Telok Ayer, where we will spend some time at two heritage sites.










Are you able to recognise the two places we visited above?

Moving on, the bus brought us to a preserved shophouse that is in a very original condition. This is the home to ArClab, The Architectural Conservation Laboratory.






They, too, are taking part in the Singapore Heritage Festival 2024.




If you are keen to learn more about their efforts in heritage conservation, you do not want to miss the several guided tours and workshops that they are conducting.
