



## SkillsFuture Career Transition Programme: Mid-Career Course Guide For Singaporeans

### Description

**SkillsFuture Career Transition Programme** is for mid-career Singaporeans and PRs who are trying to move into a different job role or sector, not just add a small certificate to an existing CV. The programme is built around train-and-place courses, so the course is supposed to come with employment facilitation rather than ending at classroom training.

That distinction matters if you are weighing a serious career switch. SCTP courses typically run from three to 12 months, with part-time and full-time formats. They are delivered by Continuing Education and Training centres, and SkillsFuture Singapore positions them around sectors with hiring opportunities such as Infocomm and Technology, Professional Services and Advanced Manufacturing.

## Frequently Asked Questions about SkillsFuture Career Transition Programme

- Workers who are still employed but preparing for a career transition.

## How The Course Format Works

SCTP is not a one-afternoon workshop. The usual commitment is closer to a short conversion programme: modular training, coursework over several months and career advisory or employment support. That makes timing important. If you are working full-time, a part-time course may be more realistic; if you are between roles, a full-time course can shorten the runway to a new sector.

Before applying, compare three things: the role the course is designed for, the hiring partners or employment support described by the training provider, and whether the schedule fits your current income needs. A course that looks attractive but blocks you from job interviews or caregiving responsibilities can become hard to complete.
