



Thailand Visa Exemption Change: What Singaporeans Must Check

Description

Thailand’s Cabinet approved replacing the broad 60-day exemption with revised 30-day and 15-day schemes, but the change takes effect only 15 days after the relevant Royal Gazette announcement. Check Thailand’s live consular list and the stay date stamped at entry. This guide is for a Singapore passport holder booking or extending a Thailand trip while the 2026 visa-exemption revision is being implemented and resolves one task: verify the live permitted-stay rule instead of relying on an old 60-day article or a future policy announcement. The material claims were checked against [Thai Consular Affairs revision notice](#) and [Thai Consular Affairs live exemption list](#).

Choose the route that matches your case

Situation	What to do
Travel date is before the published effective date	Use the rule in force on arrival
Royal Gazette commencement has been published	Use the new country-specific scheme
Trip could exceed the permitted stamp	Obtain the correct visa or lawful extension route
Airline page conflicts with Thai MFA	Ask the airline to reconcile with the current controlling notice

Separate approval from commencement

The 19 May announcement records Cabinet approval but says detailed Ministry of Interior measures will be published in the Royal Gazette and begin 15 days later. According to [Thai Consular Affairs revision notice](#), the controlling detail for this branch is the specific rule or service condition cited here.

A headline announcing the decision is not itself the effective entry rule.

Check both unilateral and bilateral routes

Singapore can appear under more than one historic exemption basis. The 2026 reform aims to remove overlapping privileges and assign one route per country or territory. According to [Thai Consular Affairs live exemption list](#), the controlling detail for this branch is the specific rule or service condition cited here.

Use the current official country list rather than assuming the broadest old scheme survives.

Verify close to departure

Check the Thai consular page when booking, again before online check-in and once more if the trip spans a policy change. According to [Thai Consular Affairs revision notice](#), the controlling detail for this branch is the specific rule or service condition cited here.

Save the dated official page or airline confirmation, but understand that border officers apply the law in force.

Read the entry stamp

The permitted-until date recorded at entry is the practical deadline for that admission. A return ticket does not extend it. According to [Thai Consular Affairs live exemption list](#), the controlling detail for this branch is the specific rule or service condition cited here.

Inspect the stamp or digital record before leaving immigration and ask immediately if it appears wrong.

Do not build a trip around an unconfirmed extension

An extension is a separate immigration decision with its own eligibility and fee. According to [Thai Consular Affairs revision notice](#), the controlling detail for this branch is the specific rule or service condition cited here.

If the trip needs more days than the verified visa-free period, apply for the appropriate visa before travel.

Keep entry basics ready

Carry a valid passport, onward plan, accommodation details and funds evidence required by the current entry guidance. According to [Thai Consular Affairs live exemption list](#), the controlling detail for this branch is the specific rule or service condition cited here.

A visa exemption waives a visa requirement; it does not guarantee admission.

Run the numbers or sequence

A traveller sees an old page promising 60 days and a newer report saying 30 days. The safe method is to identify the Gazette effective date, check Singapore on the live Thai MFA list, and plan to the entry stamp rather than either headline.

The calculation or sequence above is an LBRD working example. Replace every example input with the amount, date, access condition or document from your own case. Keep the official rate or threshold beside the working so another person can reproduce the answer.

Build a verification note another person can check

Before acting, create a one-page case note headed with the task, the date checked and the person responsible. Copy only the facts that affect your decision, then attach the statement, booking, application, receipt, map record or screenshot that supplies your own input. This separates a published rule from a personal assumption. If the official page changes, keep the earlier dated record but rework the decision with the live version.

Controlling source	What to verify	What to retain
Thai Consular Affairs revision notice	19 May 2026 Cabinet decision, planned scheme changes and Royal Gazette commencement condition.	Record the page date, the exact rule used and the case input it governs.
Thai Consular Affairs live exemption list	Current official lists of visa-exempt countries and bilateral ordinary-passport agreements.	Record the page date, the exact rule used and the case input it governs.

Read the source in context, including definitions, exceptions and effective dates. A relevant page is not proof by itself: the cited passage must contain the particular rate, deadline, eligibility condition, access rule or warning used here. Where two official channels appear inconsistent, pause and ask the authority about the exact case rather than choosing the more convenient answer.

Use the guide with its limits

Travel rules can change between booking and boarding. Check the competent authority, then the operating airline or border channel, and keep the dated confirmation offline. The officer or carrier applying the live rule remains decisive.

No interview, personal use, fresh field visit, survey result or price check is claimed unless explicitly stated. Availability, fees and procedures can change. Reopen the linked authority page immediately before payment, travel, filing or emergency use.

Before you act

1. Open the live Thai MFA list
2. Find the Gazette effective date
3. Confirm Singapore's assigned scheme
4. Check passport and onward travel

5. Recheck before departure
6. Read the entry stamp
7. Plan a visa if the stay is longer

Mistakes that change the outcome

- Treating Cabinet approval as immediate law
- Relying on an old 60-day blog
- Assuming exemption guarantees entry
- Ignoring the stamped date
- Planning an unconfirmed extension

Questions readers ask

Did Thailand approve a change?

Yes, on 19 May 2026.

Did the announcement itself start the new period?

No. It says commencement follows Royal Gazette publication by 15 days.

What date controls my stay?

The rule in force on entry and the permitted stay recorded by immigration.
